Hot Chilli Pepper Habanero Limon is almost a fruity type of chilli. They look like lemons, smell like apricots, and have a top-heavy lantern shape. They have a heat rating of 200-250 Scoville units. Grows on bushy plants, an attractive addition to the garden.

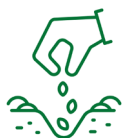

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Sowing Instructions



Sow chillies 1/4 inch deep in warm conditions.



Ensure you start these seeds off as early as possible in January or February, as they need plenty of time to produce fruit.



Grow on a warm windowsill, under a heat lamp, or a heated greenhouse, as these seeds need warmth to germinate.

Days to harvest to maturity

90-100 days.

Tips

Tie the plants to canes as they grow to help support the weight of the fruits.
